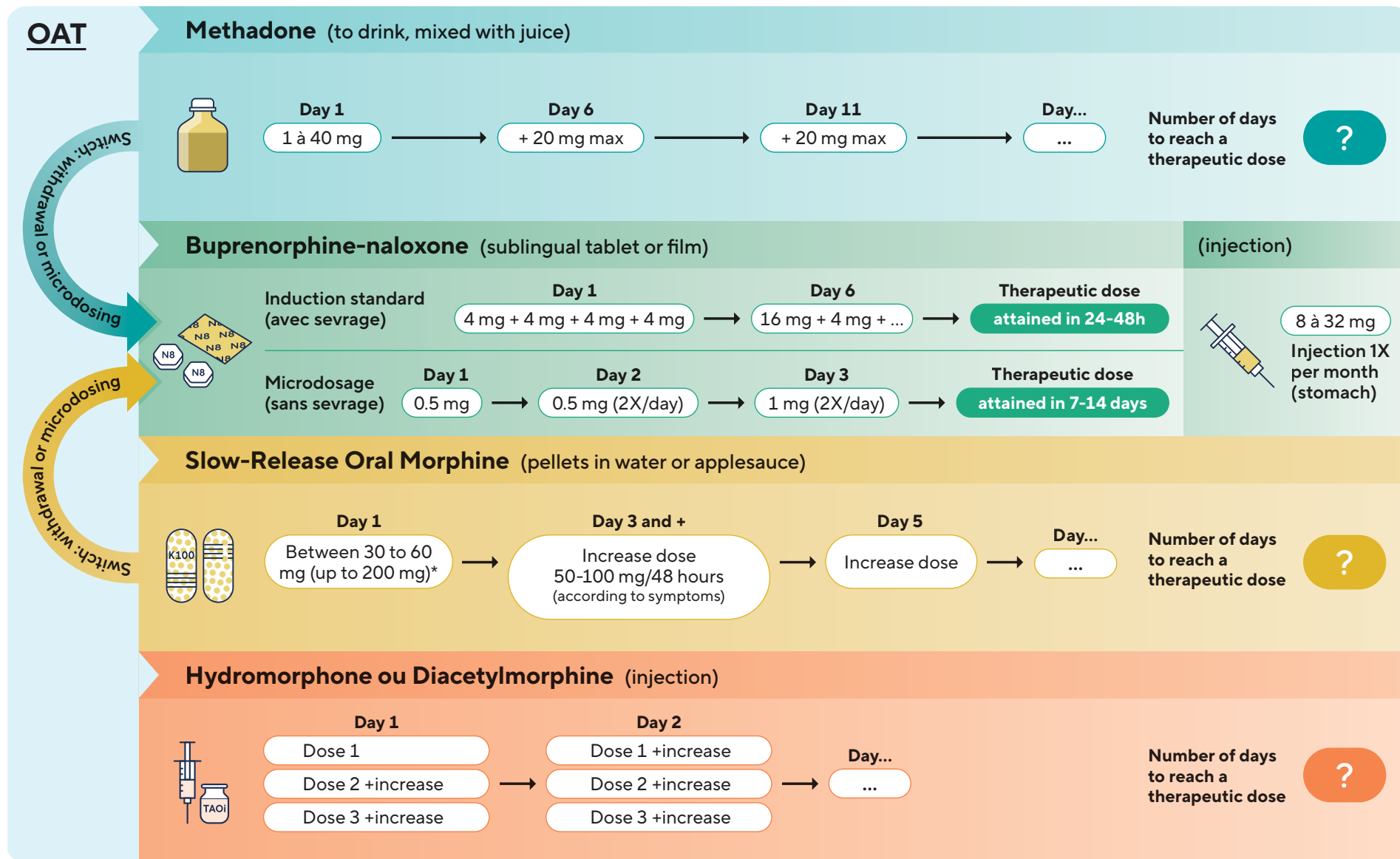


# DECISION-MAKING TOOL TO SUPPORT TREATMENT SELECTION

## Safer Supply

Usually co-prescribed with methadone or slow-release oral morphine

\*Certain prescribers, based on their clinical experience, sometimes start at 300mg or higher for their patients with very high tolerance.
